Section One: General information

1.1 Introduction

This report covers the activity of the Parking and Enforcement team for the 2018/2019 financial year.

1.2 Management

Worcester City Council manages 14 car parks; 13 surface car parks and one multi-storey car park, St. Martin's Gate. Worcester City Council also manages three on-street parking locations on behalf of Worcestershire County Council. Off street enforcement powers are contained within the Worcester City General Car Parks Order 2011 and the Croft Road Car Park Order 2011. On street enforcement powers are contained within the Traffic Regulation Orders set by the Highways Authority which is Worcestershire County Council.

1.3 Enforcement

Worcester City Council carries out parking enforcement on the public highway by way of formal agency agreement with the highways authority, Worcestershire County Council. This agency agreement is common to all six Worcestershire districts.

A team of Civil Enforcement Officers are employed to uphold standards. Parking events are classed as 'contraventions' rather than the previous 'criminal offences' and are administered under civil law. Contravention codes are listed on the City Council [website](#). Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) are issued to vehicles with a financial penalty being incurred for a contravention.

The level of penalty for infringements will be £70 for the higher band, and £50 for the lower band. If you pay within 14 days the charge will be discounted by 50%, making the charge £35 or £25 respectively.

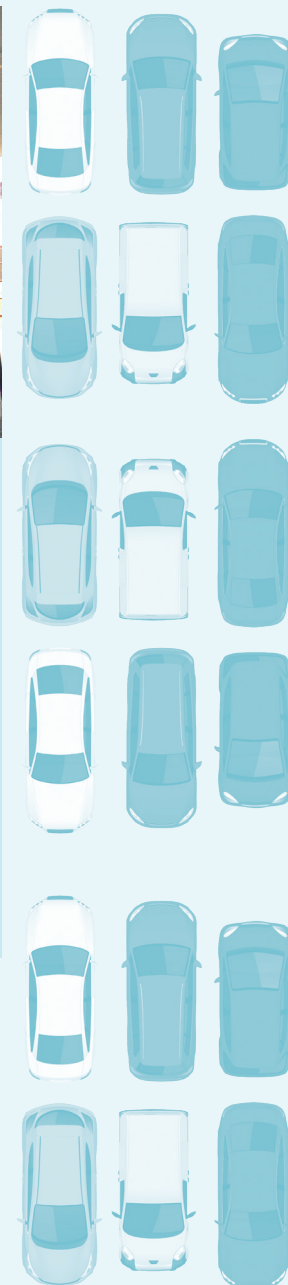


1.4 Electric vehicle charging points

There are two trickle charge points and one rapid charge point located at St. Martins Gate car park. No charge is made to the customers for the supply of electricity; drivers only pay the appropriate tariff when parking. 349 recharges were recorded during the year with a total 4,047.40 of kWh used from 76 unique users.

1.5 Complaints

During the year there were 32 complaints received through the Council's complaints system of which 13 were upheld, one was partially upheld, 16 were not upheld and two complaints were listed as other.





Section Two: Worcester City Council car parks

2.1 Tariff scales

Worcester City Council provided and operated 14 car parks, which are quality assured through the national Park Mark scheme, in the heart of the City in 2018/2019. They are divided into three distinct zones – Red, Amber and Green with the tariffs being set on the proximity of the car park to the city centre. Parking charges have remained frozen at the same level and have not risen since 2009. Worcester City Council also manages three on-street parking locations on behalf of Worcestershire County Council.

Section Three: On-street enforcement

The City Council carries out enforcement on behalf of Worcestershire County Council on the public highways, including the three on-street bays in the city centre. An informal and formal appeals process is in place.

3.3 On-street parking dispensation scheme

A one-day dispensation allows a vehicle to remain in areas where parking is normally either restricted or prohibited, up until midnight on the day of issue. These dispensations are issued on request at no charge.

A seven-day dispensation allows a vehicle to remain for a maximum of seven days, where there is a clear and genuine need to do so. These dispensations can be extended on application. We charge and administration fee of £50 for issuing a seven-day dispensation.

3.4 Residents' permit schemes

The Parking and Enforcement Service manages and monitors existing residents-only parking permit schemes. There are currently 10 residents-only parking schemes in operation throughout the City which generated a combined income of £18,110.

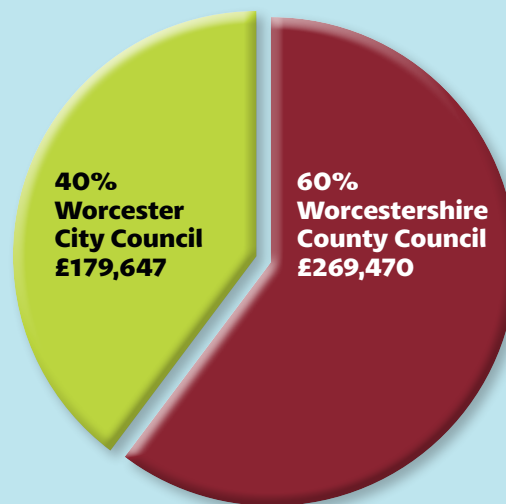

4.2 Summary of penalty charge notice income

The total Penalty Charge Notice income collected for 2018/2019 was £449,117. This income is, in accordance with the formal agency agreement, split between Worcester City Council and Worcestershire County Council on a 60%/40% ratio basis, as opposite.

4.5 Abandoned vehicles

During the year, the Parking and Enforcement Team received a total of 390 reports of abandoned vehicles in the City which resulted in nine vehicles being removed by the contractor.
